



Project 9: Internships—Opportunity for Young People to work alongside Leaders or on Fellowship Projects

The Fellowship would like to offer internship programs to potential leaders of the Indigenous community that have been identified by the Alumni network or the Advisory Committee.

Through these internships the participants will gain valuable training and experience whilst completing their studies.

We hope the skills that the interns inherit will assist them in their future careers.

The program will provide students with the opportunity to work in an office environment, where they will learn to prioritise tasks, meet deadlines, express themselves in a concise manner and demonstrate an understanding of complex topics.

The programs may include:

- Administration work for the Fellowship
- Assisting the Advisory Committee on specific projects
- Assisting the Fellow or Emerging Leaders on specific projects
- Event management
 - ⇒ For example, assisting at a Youth Forum (Fact Sheet 4)
 - ⇒ Communications

Eligibility for an internship:

- Currently enrolled in academic studies
- Be between the ages of 18 – 25
- Prove a genuine interest in the internship program
- Strong presentation and writing skills, time management skills, creative and judgements skills, and most importantly, people skills
- The ability to communicate and listen, and get on with a wide range of people from diverse backgrounds

Grant for Internships: \$25,000 per Internship
